because disasters often cause loss of life, an suffering, loss of income, and property and damage; and

because disasters often disrupt the norfunctioning of governments and commues, and adversely affect individuals and ilies with great severity;

It is the intent of the Congress, by this er, to provide an orderly and continuing of assistance by the Federal Government te and local governments in carrying out responsibilities to alleviate the suffering amage which result from such disasters

revising and broadening the scope of exng disaster relief programs;

encouraging the development of compresive disaster preparedness and assistance s, programs, capabilities, and organizas by the States and by local governments;

achieving greater coordination and resiveness of disaster preparedness and reprograms;

encouraging individuals, States, and local ernments to protect themselves by obtaininsurance coverage to supplement or ree governmental assistance;

encouraging hazard mitigation measures educe losses from disasters, including depment of land use and construction reguons: and

providing Federal assistance programs both public and private losses sustained in sters¹
