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SUBCHAPTER I-GENERAL PROVISIONS

151. Purposes of chapter; Federal Communications Commission created

For the purpose of regulating interstate and preign commerce in communication by wire nd radio so as to make available, so far as posble, to all the people of the United States, ithout discrimination on the basis of race, olor, religion, national origin, or sex, a rapid, fficient, Nation-wide, and world-wide wire and adio communication service with adequate failities at reasonable charges, for the purpose of he national defense, for the purpose of promotng safety of life and property through the use of rire and radio communications, and for the purose of securing a more effective execution of his policy by centralizing authority heretofore ranted by law to several agencies and by grantng additional authority with respect to intertate and foreign commerce in wire and radio ommunication, there is created a commission b be known as the "Federal Communications ommission", which shall be constituted as ereinafter provided, and which shall execute nd enforce the provisions of this chapter.
