The tracts of land in the State of California nown and described as follows: Commencing at e northwest corner of township 2 north, range east Mount Diablo meridian, thence stwardly on the line between townships 2 and north, ranges 24 and 25 east; thence southardly on the line between ranges 24 and 25 east the Mount Diablo base line; thence eastwardly on said base line to the corner to township 1 south, ranges 25 and 26 east; thence southwardly on the line between ranges 25 and 26 east to the southeast corner of township 2 south, range 25 east; thence eastwardly on the
